### Why ENRP?

- Flexible - enroll as a full-time or part-time student; take classes in the evening to accommodate jobs and internships.
- Multidisciplinary - curriculum includes environmental sciences, environmental economics, law, public policy, and research methods.
- Practical - apply classroom learning to a real-world environmental policy issue in the professional, client-based capstone project.
- Reputation - in Fall 2017, ENRP will become part of the Trachtenberg School, the #1 ranked school of public affairs in the D.C. area.

### Why BA/MA?

- Apply up to 12 credits towards both your Environmental Studies BA and your ENRP MA. These credits are “double-counted,” allowing you to save money on graduate school tuition.
- Earn a Master’s degree in only one additional full year of academic study (fall and spring semesters, plus one summer).
- You may be eligible for a 10 percent reduction in tuition through GWU's Grad2Grad program; for details, see [go.gwu.edu/g2g](http://go.gwu.edu/g2g).

### Eligibility Requirements:

- 1) Completed at least 75 undergraduate credits
- 2) GPA greater than 3.5 in Environmental Studies courses  
**OR** cumulative GPA greater than 3.4

### Application Components:

- Statement of purpose (500 words) describing the applicant’s intellectual interests and academic and professional goals.
- Full transcripts of all undergraduate coursework (unofficial transcript of GWU courses accepted).
- Recommendation letter written by a professor who instructs one of the courses required for the Environmental Studies major or the Director of the Environmental Studies program who can provide an informed assessment of the applicant’s work. The recommender should send this letter directly to the Director of Graduate Studies of ENRP, Nancy Augustine.
- Interview with the Director of Graduate Studies and/or the Program Director of ENRP.

**The application deadline is April 1 for summer and fall admissions and October 1 for spring admissions.**
